Dear Friends,

We are grateful for your continuing support of Belmont Against Racism (BAR), as well as for our partner organization, the LGBTQ+ Alliance. It is gratifying and encouraging that you stand with us in the work of BAR in a year filled with the horrifying and tragic mass murders in Dallas, Nashville, Buffalo, Uvalde, Jacksonville and elsewhere – five mass murders in the first four days of September! The concerns run deep for our communities and our democracy. However, there are bright spots; we see them in Belmont:

- The town Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Task Force and the Human Rights Commission continue to push for changes in town government, including calling for a town DEI Director, as recommended by the Task Force Report last year.
- Dr. Jill Geiser, Belmont's new Superintendent of Schools, and Chon'tel Washington, the school district's Director of DEI, are using equity and social justice as a framework for planning and implementing school-wide changes to push for recognizing individual learning needs of all students and putting in systems for support.
- And there are new community groups bringing awareness of the many treasured identities in our diversifying community, one of the newest being Hispanos en Belmont. They join many others.

We have continued much of the work you have helped us accomplish in the past and partnered with many community groups to support events related to Indigenous People's Day, Latin Heritage Day, Transgender Day of Visibility, the Pan Asian Coalition, and the Juneteenth Celebration. You will find a list of our activities on the back of this letter.

BAR Board members have continued to work with Belmont Public Schools leaders on issues around equity and inclusion, especially with METCO students, teacher training, student grants, and in support of school activities that promote strong relationships, address bias, and welcome all families. We have also met regularly with school leaders about the hiring process and implementing the recommendations from the Equity Audit. BAR Board members joined committees or participated in community forums about the hiring of the new Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Middle School Principal and other key leadership roles.

With your support, BAR will continue to actively focus on racial justice issues and efforts that foster diversity, equity, and inclusion in Belmont and at the state level. Thank you!
